From the minister... Jesus told a troubling parable in Luke chapter 19 about a ruler who went away to see if he could be appointed king and while away gave money to three servants who were told to make the money work for the ruler. You remember the end? Two did well and were rewarded with having rule over large areas. The third buried it and was punished for being inactive.



It is troubling because we imagine it could be us who are the ones not doing enough with what the Lord has given us – abilities, income, capital, skills. Maybe. What we do note is that the third man was bitter against his master and saw him as someone who exploits others for his own profit. He might have had a point except he misread his master. Instead of exploiting, it turns out he is the giver of gifts way in excess of any profits made. Show you can be trusted in a little and you get trusted with an enormous amount, which works for your benefit.

So where does that leave us as a church? Alarm bells sound if we turn in to keep ourselves happy, maybe harbouring thoughts that the Lord has not made us a big church so maybe best to do what makes us happy and leave the rest to someone else. Or we could hear the sound of rejoicing in heaven when we give ourselves to look ensuring our lifestyles please God, where our effort as a church is to look out to see kingdom work done and where we give ourselves to worship God who rewards us ridiculously more than we could ever deserve. I know which sound I prefer.



I have for many years been producing online bible studies. These are available at www.freebiblestudies.uk

Now I have gone back to the beginning and am editing (and correcting) them.

Having started again at Genesis, I was reminded how exciting the Bible actually is. Each study links to the next and sometimes I found it hard to stop reading! If you also start at Genesis you will be taken right through the history of God's journey with his people, leading up to the coming of Jesus, and the spread of Christianity through the then known world.

These studies contain pictures, maps, tables and charts and helpful explanations – also questions (and some answers) to get you thinking. There are also studies on specific subjects. Although they are designed as study aids, they are just as much commentaries, and as generally every verse is covered, they may simply encourage you to get reading!

Shoeboxes

Once again we hope to send Shoeboxes to Moldova and Ukraine this year. Please bring the boxes with you on 29th October, if you can't do a shoe box you

could bring any of the following items which could then be used to top up other boxes. Each shoebox should contain the following new items:

- hat/scarf/mittens (or gloves)
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- soap and flannel
- > a gift and some sweets

For a child: in addition, they can contain underwear/ socks, a soft toy, a colouring book and pencils or a jumper. A ball is a good addition.

For an adult: make-up/wind-up torch/paint set/pen and notebook/razor/shaving gel/jewellery. All items for a shoebox should be new and age appropriate. With the sweets a small bag of jellies/small chocolate bar for a younger child or for an adult a bag of mints/toffees.

If you are short then please let us know (when the boxes are dropped off) as we can add to them.

Shoeboxes should be ideally wrapped top and bottom separately and banded and as full of new goodies as possible. Please ensure any food is dated for Jan 2024.

The following items should NOT be placed in a shoebox: glass, medicines and playing cards or written word.

Please ensure all items are age appropriate.
