From the minister...in training...

Praise be to the Lord,

for he showed me the wonders of his love

when I was in a city under siege.

This is a verse from Psalm 31 which has, for pretty obvious reasons, become very important to Ukrainian Christians. It's one of those psalms that goes backwards and forwards from hope to despair, gratitude to a sense of abandonment, courage to fear but there is a repeated phrase of 'I trust in the Lord'.

We can, and should be, grateful that we are not currently in a war zone and that we only have to use this verse in a metaphorical sense. But God promises his presence in those less-real sieges too; those very real moments of fear, loss, feeling under pressure that we all feel far too often.

This week, as we emerge from Easter, we will reflect on the resurrection and what it means to live in its light. The resurrection is a powerful miracle, a world-changing event and, for us, a confirmation that our God is not just an amazing promise-maker. He is a trustworthy promise-keeper. The psalmist knew that even before the resurrection and could end Psalm 31 with these words,

Be strong and take heart,

all you who hope in the Lord.

My prayer for us all this week is that we should know God's faithful presence and live like we have a promise-keeping, refuge-providing, ever-listening, justice-giving, mercy-abounding God with us. Because we have!

UPDATE FROM CHOPS

A few weeks ago Richard shared a video by his sister about the work of CHOPS (if you missed it you can see it here <u>https://www.kcbchurch.org.uk/virtual-service/2022-04-03/11.30</u>)

Whilst the numbers of newly arriving refugees has slowed, the CHOPS centre is still just as busy distributing goods and supplies to needy Ukrainian refugees several times a week. Roman, the pastor, has recorded a video (all in Polish) which shows recent attendance at the distribution centre - <u>https://fb.watch/cDue-ZsAdp/</u>

Roman has said how grateful he is for the £2,000 donation from KCBC, it is very helpful for them to have this support as they respond to the daily needs of the refugees.

Here is how you can help:

CHOPS is an established charitable arm of my sister Helen's church in Kalisz, Poland. CHOPS is run by Roman, one of the pastors.

To support their current work with the large number of Ukrainian refugees seeking safety and accommodation in Kalisz, you can make an international payment via SWIFT. There will be a fee of between £10 and £35 per transaction. Please feel free to donate directly in this way, or if you'd prefer to avoid the transaction fee, make the payment to my UK bank account and then I'll arrange a single payment to CHOPS, so just one transaction fee for all of us together (which I'll happily cover).

To make a direct SWIFT payment to CHOPS in Kalisz, the international bank account number is: PL11 1140 2004 0000 3012 1506 9404 There will be a fee of between £10 and £35 for this transaction.

To make a payment to me, which I will include in a single donation to CHOPS, my bank sort code is 08-92-86 and the account number is 10242502 - account name is 'Mrs Cheryl & Mr Richard Adams'. There will be no fee for this payment.

If you're prefer to pay cash or cheque, just let me know.

Christian Response to Easter Europe (cr2ee)

Known by Sarah Oddy for many years, they been meeting the Ukrainian refugees at the border, providing them with food and finding them somewhere safe to stay.

Here is link to the most recent newsletter <u>April 2022 update.pdf - Google Drive</u>

They ask for:

- Funds to send the items to Moldova. Each lorry costs around £4,000.
- Again our fantastic team have stepped up to the challenge and managed to collect and sort tonnes of aid so quickly we were able to send another articulated truck just four weeks after the last one. This lorry again filled to the roof is now making its way to

Moldova to help the Ukrainian refugees and poor families in Moldova. A huge "Thank You" to all the lovely people who have donated, collected and sorted as well as those who turned out last evening to help load. The next one is due to leave in early May.

- We have also been sending funds direct to our colleagues in Moldova to enable them to buy items immediately whilst waiting for the lorry to arrive.
- Very good clothing and bedding (duvets, blankets, sheets, duvet covers, sleeping bags - not second-hand pillows), food - non-perishable and must be in date by at least 6 months, (tinned food, pasta, rice etc.), over the counter medicines, toiletries (not bubble bath as most do not have baths), sanitary towels, nappies, and incontinence pads.
- Help in collecting items from people. The lorry departs from Exmouth.
