Some of you may know that I do the occasional bit of tutoring. As teachers, we quickly learn of the difficulties faced by some kids and how these can impact on their learning. As tutors, we can choose how much or how little we want to get involved in a child's difficulties, so that's quite different and needs to be handled correctly.-

This week I met a boy who appeared to have way too much to deal with emotionally, and school was just something he could opt out of and so he did. His attendance rate had been less than half for the previous year. The problem was that his opportunity to be in a place of learning and social integration was at school. I explained to the mother that although I was willing to help, the learning would be minimal without the resource of a program to follow.

Anyway, we talked about steps that were doable, and getting back to school. I was drawn to this mother's plight because I've have experienced enough of my own. She took me into her confidence, and I began to think that in my small social circle I am seeing a lot of children who have emotional burdens that are too much for them, and who are in some way acting out.

I wondered what Jesus would want me to do. So, I prayed for this family and I ask you all to pray too. Pray for all the kids who need to know that Jesus will pour out hope and strength and love on them and pray for the adults who will reveal this to them.

This mother seemed to be reaching out to me, she was coping well and wanted to do the right thing, so she decided to ask school for specific help. I left her excitedly planning their evening meal and quiet time together. As we said our goodbyes, their dog was frantically tearing down the curtains in an attempt to get noticed by the visitor who was just leaving. I smiled as I thought, we all have needs, even the dog.

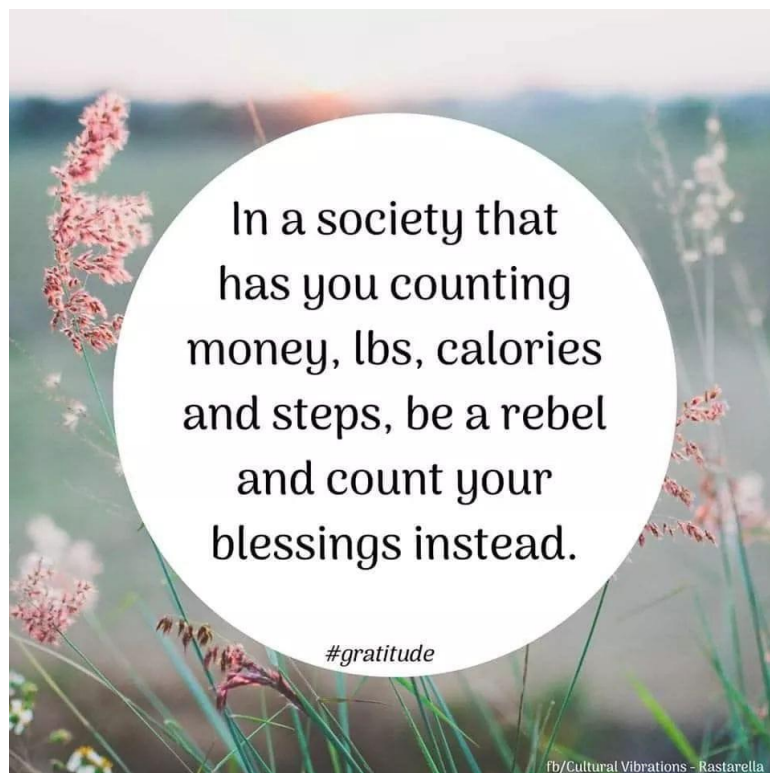
