From the Minister

Next week it is St. Valentine's Day. As part of his saintly portfolio, he is the patron saint of beekeepers. He lived around the mid-3rd century AD, so very early on in church history, and was known to have helped Christians who were being persecuted by the Roman Empire. It is said that he was executed for refusing to deny Christ by the order of the "Emperor Claudius" in the year 269.

A remarkable and courageous Christian, then. But why the link with romantic love? It is possible that, because the day to celebrate his life was on February 14th, a connection was made with an ancient belief that birds paired up in the middle of February, so his feast day was linked to pairing up and so to romantic love. Now the link is cemented by modern culture and helped along by the consumer economy.

You may not receive any cards or give out any, but take time out to celebrate the many courageous Christians throughout history and to the present day who risk their lives to rescue the persecuted and who are prepared to pay the price of refusing to deny Christ.

It was soon added to the growing pile to be sorted by the amazing volunteers at the warehouse.



Once it has been checked and sorted it is packaged into different coloured bags, depending on what it is, and then taken to another building - we were told that this pile is over 7 meters deep! Before the next lorry goes this room will be completely full.



The other aid all sorted and ready to go. The next lorry will be going to Moldova in the coming months



When CRR2EE started sending aid to Ukraine at the start of the invasion they were concerned that they would be spreading themselves too thin **but** the response has been truly amazing. *They were sending three lorries of aid a year but now are able to send seven each year!* They are also able to help in other ways due to the cash donations being made.

Thank you for your ongoing support, as one of the ministers said "You are not just giving us aid you are giving us hope and reminding us that someone cares!"

Please could you continue to pray for the following:
