From the minister (in training)...

I learnt today that for the Celts, 1st September was the new year. Which explains why I have this ancient yearning for a new pencil case and automatically put plasters on my heels to stop blisters from new shoes at this time of year. I don't think it's just me; we all love the idea of the promise of a fresh start, a new beginning and we are granted that every day with God. Thank goodness for that!

Paul reminded the people of Colossae in our verse this week though, that every day is more than a fresh start. Every day is a fresh *choice;* the chance and the duty to reaffirm our love and faith in God, to re-choose the path we took however long ago it may have been. That might feel daunting. It is a **big** commitment but God doesn't leave us alone to deal with it.

Look at Paul's words; we are rooted, we are built up, we are strengthened with and by Christ, through God's Word and through the privilege of prayer. This verse reminds me of Psalm 1 where the psalmist talks about being like a tree with deep roots soaked in God's presence. It makes that daily choice a little easier when we have a firm foundation, a solid rooting to keep us on that path we chose, however long ago.

Does that sound a little contradictory; a fresh start and also staying in the same place?! Isn't that what's wonderful about our faith? It's paradoxical and interesting and no one analogy will ever work! Both are true and my prayer for us all this week is that we find peace in the new beginnings and also strength in knowing where and who we are.

Christian Response to Easter Europe (cr2ee)

They ask for:

- Funds to send the items to Moldova. Each lorry costs around £4,000.
- We have also been sending funds direct to our colleagues in Moldova to enable them to buy items immediately whilst waiting for the lorry to arrive.
- Very good clothing and bedding (duvets, blankets, sheets, duvet covers, sleeping bags not second-hand pillows), food non-perishable and must be in date by at least 6 months, (tinned food, pasta, rice etc.), over the counter medicines, toiletries (not bubble bath as most do not have baths), sanitary towels, nappies, and incontinence pads.
- Help in collecting items from people. The lorry departs from Exmouth.

Christian Response to Eastern Europe REVIEW OF 2021

crzee's MISSION is to provide relief to disadvantaged and vulnerable people living in Eastern Europe through the support of donations received from individuals and organisations in the UK.

Help is given by supporting families, soup kitchens and churches through financial gifts, taking humanitarian aid and medical supplies, and setting up projects to provide long term benefits and independence.



- We sent £85,000 to Moldova, via trusted partners, to support families, soup kitchens and churches working with the poor
- We sent 3 lornes to Moldova containing excellent quality clothing, over 6000 Christmas shoeboxes and family boxes, and other humanitarian aid – in total over 32 tonnes of aid.
- All this was achieved despite the Coronavirus restrictions because of the amazing flexibility of our volunteers and supporters to deliver, sort and load aid when it was possible.
- In Moldova about 200 poor and needy families, 4 soup kitchens and several children's camps/activities were supported.
- It was particularly important that we maintained support for poor families in Moldova during 2021 because of the impacts of Coronavirus on health, the high inflation for fuel and other goods, and the cold winter.
- We sent out newsletters and held prayer support meetings to help keep supporters updated on cr2ee's activities.

There were 3 TRUSTEES during 2021:

- Graham Carey Chairman
- Richard Critchley Secretary and Treasurer
- · Hugh Scudder Charity Director

We met online on 5 occasions to manage cr2ee's finances and operation.


to everyone for your support, donations of money and aid, sorting and loading of aid, and many other helps. Cr2ee is able to help people in Eastern Europe only because of you.

Christian Response to Eastern Europe Ukraine Appeal update August 2022



UKRAINE APPEAL HIGHLIGHTS

cr2ee's Ukraine Appeal was launched in February. There has been an amazing response:

- · Many donations of money and humanitarian aid
- · Our stores were overflowing with aid
- Massive work by volunteers in our stores
- · Our Romanian driver prioritised our deliveries
- · Our partners in Moldova provided amazing help to refugees

As a result, cr2ee has been able to:

- Send money weekly/fortnightly to our partners helping Ukrainian refugees in total about £87,000 has been sent
- Send 3 lorry loads to Moldova full of clothing, bedding and other vital humanitarian aid for Ukrainian refugees
- · Send 2 lorry loads direct to Ukraine with food and humanitarian aid
- · We are continuing with our work for Ukrainians

We want to say a massive "THANK YOU" to all who have supported the appeal in so many ways.

OUR SUPPORT FOR MOLDOVA CONTINUES

Sadly, the needs of vulnerable and poor families continue, and indeed are worsening due to rising prices and very poor harvests.

During 2022, cr2ee has continued to:

- Send monthly family support and one-off grants (over 200 families are supported)
- · Support soup kitchens and the work of our partners

Also, Hugh has visited Moldova in April/May and July/August to encourage our partners and understand the needs.
