## Exeter Cathedral Exhibition: Threads through Revelation Until Monday 19th December 2016

This display - 14 huge panels - is one artist's interpretation of many of the images in the book of Revelation. It records a series of extraordinary visions. It's about issues of life and death, Apocalypse and Armageddon, good and evil, hope and resurrection, and a New Earth and a New Heaven. Threads through Revelation may well be the largest piece of work by a single textile artist. It's touring British cathedrals for three years. The techniques used are very unusual, combining dyed fabrics and multi-layered silks, stitched and trimmed - with over 10 million stitches!
