We have received a thank you letter from Hugh at CR2EE

Dear Sarah and all brothers and sisters in Christ at Kingsteignton Community Baptist Church

This is a somewhat belated letter to thank you and the congregation for the kind donation of £50, the shoeboxes and other aid, thank you very VERY much.

I am in contact with Ukraine daily and generally sad with all I hear about their difficult life and increasing problems associated with the recent escalation and bombardment of the power stations.

Ukraine is, or should I say was, a developed country. In the cities many people were enjoying a cosmopolitan and vibrant lifestyle, many cafes and restaurants etc. Modern flats are dependent on power, as are many of the newer homes. With no power and no fireplaces, I have no idea how they will cope with the bitter winter temperatures.

The future is so uncertain and we as a charity, have to adapt to their changing needs. At the moment, in addition to the aid trucks we are planning to send even more money to support our partners there to provide a warm environment and as much food as we can afford.

Thanks to the fantastic help we have had this year we have managed to send seven articulated trucks filled to the roof with much aid and in addition, we have sent over £185,000 to Ukraine and Moldova. I think this is an amazing achievement for a local charity; this has only been possible thanks to lovely and generous people like you.

I am encouraged by the determination of the Ukrainians and I know for certain the help the are getting from abroad is a huge help to them as well as obviously the practical help.

All the best wishes to you all for 2023.
