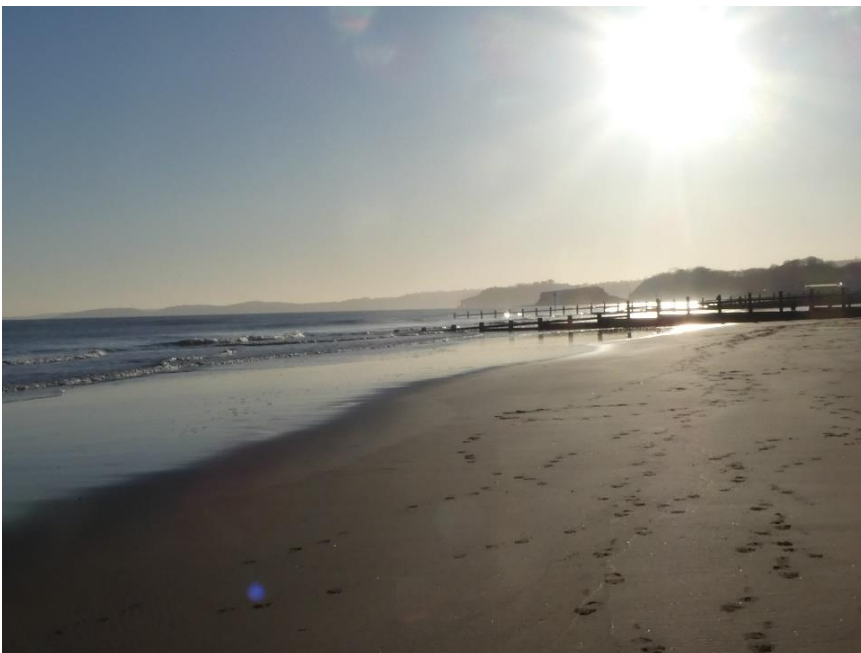

Can you see me in Creation?

(an excerpt from Letters from my Father by Wendy Thomas)



My dear child,

Come with me for a walk beside the sea. I know how much you enjoy watching the sea and indeed I made it for your enjoyment and to draw you to me – as I did everything I made.

I knew the things that would stir your heart and I will use everything to show people how much I love them. I know the vastness of the sea seems unending but even the sea is not as vast as my love for you.

No ocean could contain the amount of love I have for you – no world, no universe, for it is unending.

My thoughts of you are as endless as the sand on the seashore, does that excite you? Does it give you some sense of how much I love you, how precious you are to me? Bend down and pick up a handful of sand. Can you count the grains in one handful? Of course you can't! So it is even more impossible for you to know the number of thoughts I have of you. I never stop thinking of you; you are always on my mind. I love you that much.

Look at the sea gently lapping the shore, so gentle and soothing and my life is like that at times. My love will soothe and calm you and give you peace. Sometimes my love will feel like gentle waves washing over you and refreshing you. Sometimes the sea can be rough though with mighty crashing waves and everything in it or in its way is changed and affected by it. So too with my love; sometimes it comes in force, in huge waves overwhelming you and stirring you so you have to respond.

I want you to know the height; the breadth and depth of my love even though it is unknowable and so vast. Trust me and come even deeper into my love. Let me overwhelm you so all you can taste, feel, see, hear and comprehend is my love for you.

Everywhere you go, everything you see, everything that happens; I want you to feel my love for you within it. My love for you will never end and will never change so lose yourself in my love.
