CAP Update

The first Lockdown brought about a 3-month closure to new clients. As the Service had re-opened to new clients only 2 months earlier, (CAP Head Office had stopped all new referrals for 6 months to recruit and train new personnel & comply with FCA regulations), this resulted in much reduced caseloads. Training for all CAP roles continued online and the 2

Teignbridge Debt Coaches (Val from KCBC and Frances Tilley from Chudleigh Baptist Church) received training in the changed model of delivery of debt help/advice i.e. from home visits to audio or video appointments.

The capacity of the Teignbridge Centre was reduced by HQ by one third, to accommodate the online submission and processing of documents which proved problematic to several clients and more time consuming for the teams preparing the debt advice.

In light of the above, our Debt Centre was serving less than half of the households at the start of 2021, than it was at the beginning of 2020. We started the year with 26 households and ended the year with 12. Through the year we provided debt help to clients living in: Teignmouth, Dawlish, Newton Abbot, Kingsteignton, Chudleigh, Bovey Tracey, Heathfield, Moretonhampstead and Ashburton.

Although the two Lockdowns and imposed restrictions limited client contact and fundraising activities, CAP Teignbridge was able to continue benefitting clients in the community by carrying out Debt help and advice via video link and telephone calls. Some face to face contacts were possible when restrictions were eased. Users of our service also benefitted







from practical and housekeeping support. We have been able to access monies from CAP HQ which had been raised specifically for emergency aid for those whose households had been adversely affected by Covid. Where appropriate, this includes help with food, utilities, prescription costs, School uniform, Interview clothing and kitchen items. Additionally, a Christmas hamper of food and gifts was given to each family and arrangements were made with voluntary organisations to provide plated Christmas dinners to vulnerable clients who were alone.

Some clients have suffered with anxiety and depression during this time, as the isolation of Lockdowns caused or added to, mental ill health. These clients have expressed their thanks to the team of CAP supporters, in particular to befrienders who have kept in touch to support them by telephone, text messaging and occasional meet ups, as allowed. The team of CAP supporters also were involved in: helping clients to move house; providing needed furniture and white goods and accompanying a client to Court in Plymouth.

Befrienders attend different Teignbridge Churches and feedback to their Ministers/congregation as requested. Stakeholders have Val's telephone number and contact her directly to discuss issues such as making referrals. In previous years, meetings took place with various groups, such as the Universal Credit team, Mental Health providers and Job Centre teams. Also, talks took place in a number of Churches at their morning services; neither of these have been possible during this last year – they have been missed. However, the regular meeting of CAP supporters, which takes place on the last Tuesday of each month, has continued on Zoom since the first Lockdown. Plans for developments and relevant activities, are considered jointly and consensus is sought for the way forward.

We hope to resume 'service as normal' shortly and we need more befrienders...if you are interested in becoming involved, please contact Val who will be pleased to hear from you!
