From the minister...

On the radio, the politician being interviewed was questioned on why their political party was taking so much attention away from pressing world needs like world conflicts and the national cost of living crisis with their internal bickering. Before we get all self-righteous about not being as bad as them, it might be helpful to turn to examine the church.

In the local community of the churches, it is all too easy for us too, to be so absorbed in our own internal issues that we neglect the great calling to be Christ's representatives in the world. The church in this part of Devon has a long history of internal and interchurch conflicts which often hinder our ability to work together for the sake of the Gospel. So what do we do about our differing views on those hot topics like gender orientation, the role of women in church, the real meaning of the Lord's Supper – the list goes on?

We can't simply say that such issues don't matter. Instead, it can be helpful to give them a weight and question whether they are big enough to swamp our common bond found in Jesus. I know that sounds a bit simplistic, and to an extent it is, but it is how we have operated in our local clergy group. We are rather different in our marital set up, in our views on how church ought to be done, on our approach to Bible interpretation. But monthly we do lay that aside and work together because of our shared love of Christ and our commitment to bringing the Gospel to our local community. And for that I give thanks to God.
