# From the minister (in training)...

Jesus said, "it is not the healthy who need a doctor, but those who are ill. But go and learn what this means: "I desire mercy not sacrifice." For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners. Matthew 9:12-13



I sometimes wonder what would have happened to our Bible if an editor had got hold of it; if someone had changed the words of Jesus to be more flowing, to make more sense. Because this verse sounds like a bit of a non sequitur, doesn't it? He's talking about being ill...no...he's talking about sacrifices...no..he's talking about sin.

The truth, of course, is that this does make perfect sense in the context of God made flesh, a saviour walking on the Earth and a learned rabbi teaching his people. Jesus was all of those things and he had a message that was unexpected. The long-awaited Messiah was not just for the Chosen People, and not even just for those who had kept God's strict laws of cleanliness and separation. In fact, to the horror of those who (largely wrongly) placed themselves in that category, quite the opposite.

Jesus came for the least, the last and the lost; those who were unclean, sinful, did not have all the answers. Which is just as well, for me at least.

Jesus quotes God's words as given to the people of Israel by Hosea (6:6); mercy not sacrifice, acknowledgement of God not burnt offerings. The challenge still stands for us today to offer kindness over a requirement for people to jump through Christian hoops and understanding over judgement. Jesus would be a pretty poor doctor if he let us stay

poorly so there will always be a need for growth and change when we acknowledge him, but he's the doctor, not us!

Getting well means so much more than being disease-free and definitely more than simply avoiding those we think will make us somehow dirtier or *iller*. Perhaps like Jesus we are being asked to get a bit dirtier to bring people to find the kind of cleanness, wellness and wholeness that Jesus offers us all.

### Christian Response to Easter Europe (cr2ee)

#### They ask for:

- Funds to send the items to Moldova. Each lorry costs around £4,000.
- We have also been sending funds direct to our colleagues in Moldova to enable them to buy items immediately whilst waiting for the lorry to arrive.
- Very good clothing and bedding (duvets, blankets, sheets, duvet covers, sleeping bags not second-hand pillows), food non-perishable and must be in date by at least 6 months, (tinned food, pasta, rice etc.), over the counter medicines, toiletries (not bubble bath as most do not have baths), sanitary towels, nappies, and incontinence pads.
- Help in collecting items from people. The lorry departs from Exmouth.
