WORD ALIVE

We meet again this Sunday evening for Word Alive at 30 Slanns Meadow.

'Once Saved, Always Saved'? Someone in the area emailed me saying that he could not possibly be part of a church that did not hold to OSAS.

How can we have assurance of our salvation if it can be lost? Then again, surely we know of those who do, until the day they die, renege on their faith. John 10:28 tells us no one can snatch us out of God's hands but Hebrews 6:4-6 talks of those who fall away not being able to repent. Matt.24:13 says we need to endure to the end but Philipians1:6 states that the Lord will finish the good work started in us.

So we draw up in our battle lines. Historically, Calvinists are OSAS, Armenians the opposite. Reformed vs Baptist vs Anglican vs Catholic. Their disagreements have been very strong.

But we will not draw up in our battle lines. Instead, we will consider the Word, our issues of assurance, experience of those turning back and maybe back again, and our confidence in the promises of the Lord and what they mean to us. And in doing so, we draw closer to God.
