
A FEW THANK YOUS

Today is the Fourth Sunday in Advent

When Traditionally Christians all over the world light the fourth candle of the Advent Wreath. But what does it all mean?



The Wreath: The wreath itself means "victory" as Christ's victory over sin so He can save us. The Advent Wreath has 4 or 5 candles that are arranged in a circle symbolizing Christ's eternity, as a circle has no beginning and has no end, it is a symbol for God, who is eternal and thus without beginning or end. The evergreens mean He is "ever with us," they are usually pine branches or holly that are used as a base that represents anticipation, newness, renewal and His everlastingness. The red berries of the holly represent the shedding of Christ's blood.

The fourth candle "ANGEL CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF LOVE" The angels announced the good news of a Saviour. God sent his only Son to earth to save use, because he loves us!

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. John 3:16-17

On Christmas Day we light the traditionally white central candle, the "CHRIST CANDLE", the central reason for Christmas. The white candle reminds us that Jesus is the spotless lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins! His birth was for his death, his death was for our birth!


We need to encourage each other and stay connected. Do you have a Bible verse, poem, passage or song or any of the following? Something you are thankful for. Something that has made you laugh.


