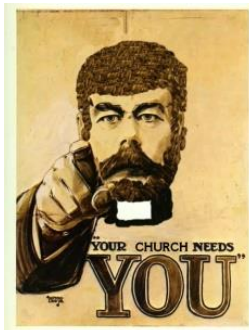
The clocks go forward that evening, so note in GMT this is 5:45 a.m.
