From the Pastor...

Someone was telling me today that he had noticed a change in the way many customers have changed the way they respond to staff at their complaints desk. Previously, they were usually able to come to a quick resolution to product returns but over the last 6 months things have changed. So much so that 5 people have walked out of the job of being on the complaints desk. Customers have been less civil, more demanding and more aggressive too. So what has changed?

Maybe there is built up stress from lockdown. Or is it that some have forgotten their social skills? It could be that people are feeling the squeeze. I don't know. But some people are not getting on well with facing problems like a product fault.

If there is an increase in tension in the wider community, we can expect that in churches too. We have to face it, we are under more strain. All those Covid restrictions, masks, sanitising, fuel shortages, gas price rises, delivery problems. What do we do?

The Apostle Peter draws attention to Proverbs 10 verse 12 *Hatred stirs up conflict, but love covers over all wrongs*, rephrasing it in 1Peter 4 verse 8 as, *Love covers over a multitude of sins*. We are under pressure, there is more anxiety around and we will

have things to fall out over. So we are going to need an awful lot more of that love which covers. And if an issue can't be covered so easily, take it very seriously and go to the teaching of Jesus, who said in Matthew 18:15, 'If your brother or sister sins against you, go and point out their fault, just between the two of you.' Anything but let it fester and you end up banging tables and demanding to see the manager!
