With myself, we are all the church trustees as far as the Charities Commission are concerned. Add in Rose (who we exempt from trusteeship) and we have the team.

Our role is to help the church in expressing our faith in Christ as Lord through our key FIRE purposes (or in official words, 'the advancement of the Christian faith'). We do this as the whole church, with the leadership team helping equip people by ensuring smooth running and planning, overseeing pastoral care and being the port of first call in emergencies.

My name is Simon and I'm part of the Glo Community in Torbay.

I've recently started a project called "Life of Rhythm" which aims to help people learn to deal with stress and the chaos of life, by learning simple practices based on the life of Jesus.

As part of this mission I am running a number of Guided Walks on Dartmoor, each with a different theme.

One of the practices Jesus regularly adopted was to spend time alone in the Er-ay-mos (the wilderness, desert, desolate place).

Dartmoor is one of those places - a wild, desolate landscape. where it's easy to find some silence and solitude.

Jesus visited these places, on numerous occasions, to take time away, to re-charge, re-focus and receive. And so during my guided walks we will do the same, through some simple guided practices.

The initial walks I'm arranging include De-Stress Walks and Retreat Walks with more to follow including Discovering our True Identity, Men's, Women's, Sunset, Star Gazing and many more. I can also Bespoke Group Walks which can be tailored to individual requirements including teams, communities and youth.
