From the minister...

Can you trust anyone these days? What do you think? Trust is a fragile thing yet it is what enables us to cooperate in families, communities, even nationally. We have to keep working out who or what we can trust if we are to navigate our way through life. It's more than a feeling and is essential to everyday life.

Companies need people to trust their product so will defend their reputation. In the USA, a company that make the election voting equipment, Dominion, had argued that trust in their product was damaged by Fox News by helping to peddle conspiracy theories about its equipment after the 2020 presidential election. This was no small thing and both sides agreed a \$787.5m (£633m) settlement which was done out of court to protect Fox News' reputation being further damaged in a high-profile defamation trial. Trust – it's worth big money to protect it.

Trust and faith are closely linked. Our trust in one another is sometimes simply assumed or it is hard earned. Either way, it is worth protecting. Trust in God, likewise, is worth protecting and nurturing. As trust grows, so we learn to lean on the One we trust. And faith, so similar to trust, is more than a feeling. It is something we live by.

If you find trust difficult, you may have a very short list of who you can trust these days. I assume the Lord is on your list. But that trust and faith is under regular bombardment, yet worth making every effort to strengthen. So live by faith.
