We are going to attempt to record something on a regular basis that we are grateful to the Lord for. Regular may be daily, weekly or monthly. Daily is best except for the more complex ideas. We will encourage each other, share what we have done - and bless the Lord together.

Here are just a few of the ways you might try to record your thankfulness moments...

- Keep a daily diary. See Sarah if you want some blank diary pages
- Bookmarks. See Jack if you want blank bookmarks – adults or children's
- Photographs. Build up an album or a chart
- Scrapbook or Box
- Collage
- Email diary. See the display board for how to send reminder emails to yourself to log something
- Jars – fill with paper slips. You could include thankfulness prayers
- Post-its. Stick them on a sheet of paper to keep them safe
- Lego. Make it then photograph it.
