News from the CAP Teignbridge Debt Centre:

We are currently supporting 15 clients across Teignbridge, helping to release the weight of debt and also supporting them practically and emotionally.

A client had been taking her washing to her Mum's for many years as she was unable to save up for a washing machine, despite efforts to try and save. A member of a local church had a spare washing machine, which has now been donated and installed in the client's home. Many clients have pre-payment meters for their energy which often have much higher standing charges than other meters. Through CAP, we have been able to provide many fuel top-up vouchers for those who are struggling to make ends meet.

Are you passionate about helping others, a good listener, and have 4 hours/month available? We are currently looking for more befrienders to join a debt coach on client visits.

I feel like I may not have managed to share with everyone yet how we have just come back from Iceland. It was lovely, thank you for asking. We saw some beautiful scenery and some simply mind-boggling scenery. This lava beach probably comes under the latter heading.



There were a couple of trolls turned into rock by the rising sun a bit further up the beach, but I was very struck by this bit of dark, inhospitable, gritty beach; symbol of the brutality of the earth and the power of volcanoes and the elements of nature. Because if you look more closely at the larger white stone in the middle of the picture.....



You will see a tiny white flower, growing in the dark, inhospitable, gritty lava. Better botanists than I may even be able to identify it but to me it is, simply, **hope**. It is a thing of beauty, struggling and surviving, precious just because it exists.

We have sweated through a heatwave, which means by the time you get this we will be sheltering from torrential rain or shivering against a grey sky, but we are at least in summer. For so many people, the coming winter is going to be a really challenging time of choosing between heating and eating, of protecting the vulnerable without making themselves even more so. And for so many of us that will make us feel as isolated and alone as that little white flower.

These coming months, we as individuals and as a church need to hold fast to our sure and certain knowledge that we are children of God, loved and cherished and valuable. It is true of us and also of those around us. Does everyone around us know their true worth? Do we all understand just how precious we are in the eyes of the One who made them?

We need to hold fast and to act on those convictions, wherever our frontline is; families, workplaces, schools, out and about at the shops, in cafes. Let's look for the opportunities to lift people, build them, celebrate and help them.

Let's look for the tiny white flowers and treat them as the precious, surprising, tenacious gifts they are.

If you would like to have those opportunities presented to you, there are still spaces for befrienders on our new Linking Lives listening scheme, launching in the autumn. HITS and THAT tell us the donations have dropped off. CAP are looking for befrienders and financial support.

Christian Response to Easter Europe (cr2ee)

They ask for:

- Funds to send the items to Moldova. Each lorry costs around £4,000.
- We have also been sending funds direct to our colleagues in Moldova to enable them to buy items immediately whilst waiting for the lorry to arrive.
- Very good clothing and bedding (duvets, blankets, sheets, duvet covers, sleeping bags not secondhand pillows), food - non-perishable and must be in date by at least 6 months, (tinned food, pasta, rice etc.), over the counter medicines, toiletries (not bubble bath as most do not have baths), sanitary towels, nappies, and incontinence pads.
- Help in collecting items from people. The lorry departs from Exmouth.
