From the minister (in training)...

So Boaz said to Ruth, "My daughter, listen to me. Don't go and glean in another field and don't go away from here. Stay here with the women who work for me. Watch the field where the men are harvesting, and follow along after the women. I have told the men not to lay a hand on you. And whenever you are thirsty, go and get a drink from the water jars the men have filled." Ruth 2:8-9

I have a friend who is convinced she can smell autumn and particularly the difference in aroma between summer and autumn. I think her nose must be twitching this week. There is a slight chill and certainly more gloom as I write this. I wonder what it is like in Australia.....?

As our thoughts turn to the leaves turning, longer evenings and an excuse to start having tomato soup for lunch, we also think about Harvest. Most of us have little real connection with

the land any more so probably put little thought into the mechanics of an actual harvest but for the purposes of tradition and scripture even those of us who have never ploughed, scattered, fed or watered a field think about Harvest (the celebration with a capital H).

The Bible has several themes that run through it from beginning to end and one of them is God's provision and how he wants us to view that provision. He has done a pretty good job; there is enough food in the world even now as the global population tips over 7 billion. And yet....there is famine, there is want and there is need in many places. 50 million people in 45 countries are teetering on the edge of famine, according to the World Food Programme. This is not to make us feel helpless or guilty for having a decent meal tonight but God laid down some pretty specific rules about caring for widows and orphans, for supporting those who could not support themselves and for sharing good fortune. Boaz is clearly a decent bloke, but actually he was just doing what God had instructed everyone to do.

Did Boaz need *all* of his harvest or could he spare some for others? Here's another question; did Boaz see it as *his* harvest, or was it really God's? Does that make a difference to how easy it is to share? Whether we are Ruth in need of protection or Boaz capable of giving it, let's look out for one another. God has provided us with love, grace, life and much else; is it even sharing if it was a gift in the first place?

Christian Response to Easter Europe (cr2ee)

They ask for:

- Funds to send the items to Moldova. Each lorry costs around £4,000.
- We have also been sending funds direct to our colleagues in Moldova to enable them to buy items immediately whilst waiting for the lorry to arrive.
- Very good clothing and bedding (duvets, blankets, sheets, duvet covers, sleeping bags not second-hand pillows), food non-perishable and must be in date by at least 6 months, (tinned food, pasta, rice etc.), over the counter medicines, toiletries (not bubble bath as most do not have baths), sanitary towels, nappies, and incontinence pads.
- Help in collecting items from people. The lorry departs from Exmouth.
