So very slowly, as a church, we are reconnecting with the local community. They have hardly seen us for 18 months! We have met a few families over the last few weeks at KILTS, though we are rebuilding from a low number. But if KCBC were to engage with the town in some sort of caring expression, what would it look like?

Would it be something we would have to run ourselves so we can take charge of it? Would we tack onto something another group are already doing or would be work in partnership? And what is needed?

One of the real challenges in Kingsteignton is knowing what the needs are. Without a central place where people gather and with the residents largely unknown to each other in a swap of recent or new housing, how would we know? It has been 10 years since I did a study on that, and much has changed since then. So time for another look.

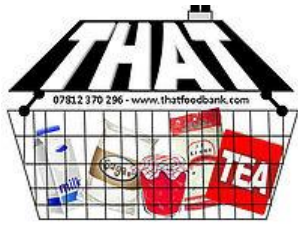
Getting going again

As we look to get the church functioning again, there are many ways you can get involved. Here are some to consider.

- Help operate the PA. Not over-taxing as our young people have shown over the Summer. Full training is provided.
- Operating the laptop and projector. Young people have shown the way again over the Summer. It is not too complicated but a vital part of what we offer in the service.
- Setting up the hall. Chairs, tables, bits and pieces of PA all need getting out those cupboards and putting in the right place. Come down at 9:00 to lend a hand.
- Welcoming. Each week 2 people need to be on the doors from 10:00 to welcome everyone, hand things out and be around should help be needed in the service.
- Help with Eagles and Owls on a rota basis.
- Serving refreshments. As we start this up again, eventually we need a team to sustain it.
- KILTS and Messy Church. We need a new set of people for each as our teams have been depleted over lockdown. KILTS resumes again on the 14th September.

A full instructions are provided for each team.
