I recently read the following from Life Every Day from Jeff Lucas; I hope it encourages you as it did me...

God Knows

"God knows". It's a saying that people often use when they have come to a place where they have no answers or solutions to a problem, and are on the verge of giving up. But as believers, we don't use the phrase just when we come to the end of our resources or understanding. Rather, we affirm that in a world where the superficial and the image are paramount, and people rarely have relationships where they are deeply known, God sees us with total clarity, and actually knows us better than we know ourselves. That truth has been used to intimidate; the parent says to the naughty child, "God is watching you. He sees when you are bad". And that is true, and Hannah, in her prayer, calls for the proud and arrogant to repent because God sees through their actions and is aware of their motives.

Do not keep talking so proudly or let your mouth speak such arrogance, for the Lord is a God who knows. 1 Samuel 2:3.

We can strut about and pretend with others, but he is not fooled.

But let's also celebrate the truth that in his complete knowledge of us, God loves us totally, right now. His love is not based on romantic illusion. We cannot surprise Him, because everything about us is laid bare before Him and in that full knowledge of our sins, our struggles, our mixed motives, He loves us. As Hannah celebrates the God who broke into a life with a wonderful answer to prayer, she is so aware that God saw her personal predicament and acted.

To God, we are no a face in the crowd, and whatever is unfolding in your life right now, He sees it. Pray in the good of that truth. You are known by Him
