We have had our first hybrid worship time at the Community Hall and everyone who was there seemed delighted to be there. Those on Zoom also reported a good experience and sense of joining with us in the hall. For this, we thank the Lord. God is good!

This Sunday, our numbers at the hall will be very low, as it is half term and many are away. So if you are hesitant about meeting up, this is a good Sunday to come along. You will have plenty of space and little to worry about with crowds. It may help you build confidence in meeting up. Do let Sue know, so she can book you in.

Now we are having live worship at the Community Hall, a reminder of the way it works...

*We will join together in a hybrid time of live and Zoom, a key difference of the live service having singing together and an opportunity for talking face-to-face afterwards outside the hall.*

*It is anticipated that we will all come back at our own pace. Some are waiting to get both jabs, others seeing how it goes, others diving in straight away and paving the way for the rest of us.*

*Our meeting is to be as safe as we can reasonably make it. The hall is sanitised before we arrive (and after!), the numbers meeting are low, and we will have plenty of ventilation. If you are concerned about meeting others, you may come and go without*

*being anywhere near anyone and do not need to chat. You may even leave before the outdoors singing.*

*We will respect those who are attending but need to take extra care because they can't (yet) have a vaccination. We will keep a reasonable distance when talking and avoid contact like shaking hands or hugging, except with permission.*
