## **The Mysteries of the Old Testament**

**Is the Old Testament a bit of a mystery to you? Would you like to find a way into the treasures there? Then please read on ...**

SWBA are delighted to invite you to a two Saturday teaching course on 6<sup>th</sup> November and 4<sup>th</sup> December – on Zoom and at our Exeter Office.

The tutor from Bristol Baptist College, Revd Dr Helen Paynter, is excellent and possesses the rare gift of being able to communicate sometimes complicated concepts in a wonderfully accessible way – you will be blessed!

The teaching will introduce you to the diversity of biblical literature in the Old Testament enabling you to engage critically with it, relate it to its historical context and explore how your own context affects your reading of the text. By looking at the whole picture and at selected texts, you will have the opportunity to reflect on its meaning for your own life, the ministry and mission of your church, and the life of your community.



You can either attend just the teaching days as a Saturday Student (£25), or enrol as a 'Prepare, Feed, Sustain' Student to achieve a certificate from Bristol Baptist College on successful completion of a written piece of work for each of the 12 PFS modules (£50/module).

Teaching will be either 'in-person' in Exeter or is also available by Zoom.
