From the minister

Working in the wider community can be so frustrating. There can be talk groups out of which nothing is actually done, councils blocking plans, permissions not given and often a lack of people to get on board with an idea. Perseverance is called for.

In my early days in Kingsteignton, we produced the Welcome Pack for people new to town. It took a while, but was out there for a few years with KCBC central to producing it. The carol service in lockdown brightened up many a household in tough times. Again, time consuming but many at KCBC helped while we interacted with many in town who contributed.

Now, Linking Lives and the new initiative at St. Michael's Primary School, working with mums, is taking much perseverance and we have to adjust to the shape that these things take as we go along. Such is work in the community.

Last Friday I met with a number of people at the community garden. This has been worked on for ages, with various people doing their thing there but we have always seemed a long way from what myself and Maggie Bonnell at KingsCare have hoped for, which is as a therapeutic place for those who need a place to relax, meet others and benefit from a bit of gardening. Most of those who had done the work couldn't attend, but a few came from the pool of people we hoped to reach and they got to work clearing and weeding (the dock weeds were very satisfying to dig out) while chatting away. Meanwhile, I was able to talk with a few people about what it was like to be a Christian in a factory environment.

Community work – frustrating, full of surprises and involves being alongside local people who put a lot of hard work into the town. And that garden, one day, will be ready for you to join with others in making it look good all year round.
