It is good now and again to reflect and give thanks to God on His rich provision for us as a fellowship. What better time to do this than when we have just received a £10074.50 tax refund from the government! This is a hefty and important slice of our annual church budget which stands at about £60,000. Gift aid, as it is called, allows us to reclaim 25p for every £1 we give to the church from the government, either directly through the banking system or via our offertory giving. KCBC is entirely self-funded and so it is the responsibility of us all to give regularly as we are able (within our own budgets) and to periodically review the level of our giving.
