From David

In the Spring, we spent time looking at various episodes in the Bible that narrated how the people of God coped coming out of tough times and how the Lord steered them through as they readjusted. So we looked at the Exodus, the Exile and the Book of Acts. We still need that guidance.

After trauma and great change it takes much effort to get back on an even keel. The Lord had to stop the Israelites from going back to Egypt when it suddenly looked so good. The Lord sent Nehemiah and Ezra to drive the people to rebuild the Temple after

the Exile in Babylon when they were settling for second best. The Lord sent the Holy Spirit to empower the early church when Jesus was no longer bodily present.

So we press on with God's help. Moses testifies to the discontent he experienced as people turned on him in the wilderness. We need to be able to bring that to the Lord to find better ways of facing such feelings.

We press on with God's help. Nehemiah testifies to the frustration he faced as people neglected the Lord's work and settled in to make themselves cosy. We need to respond to the prompting of the Spirit to move out from any cosy spot we have settle in and take a step out with the Lord.

We press on with God's help. The Apostles testify to the fear they all had when Jesus Ascended and then to fear overcome as they were filled with the Spirit and the church was born and the world transformed.

So if you are struggling to get going again, facing the new patterns of church and life then press on. Pray now that the Lord will fill you afresh, and fill you with boldness to step out with Him.

Getting going again

As we look to get the church functioning again, there are many ways you can get involved. Here are some to consider.

- Help operate the PA. Not over-taxing as our young people have shown over the Summer. Full training is provided.
- Operating the laptop and projector. Young people have shown the way again over the Summer. It is not too complicated but a vital part of what we offer in the service.
- Setting up the hall. Chairs, tables, bits and pieces of PA all need getting out those cupboards and putting in the right place. Come down at 9:00 to lend a hand.
- Welcoming. Each week 2 people need to be on the doors from 10:00 to welcome everyone, hand things out and be around should help be needed in the service.
- Help with Eagles and Owls on a rota basis.
- Serving refreshments. As we start this up again, eventually we need a team to sustain it.
- KILTS and Messy Church. We need a new set of people for each as our teams have been depleted over lockdown. KILTS resumes again on the 14th September.

A full instructions are provided for each team.

If you are able to help please let David or a member of the leadership team know you really will be an answer to prayer.... Thank you



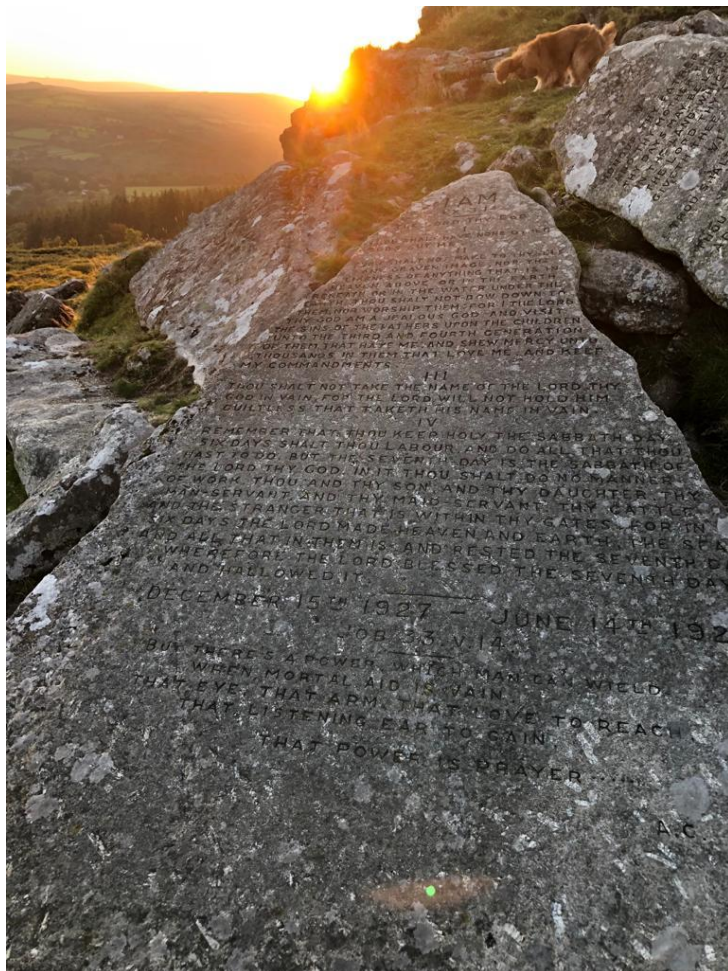
