Some creative ways to pass the time at home this month

3rd: It's Sandwich Day. Try whipping up a unique and original sandwich from whatever ingredients you can find in your cupboards and fridge.

4th: November is National Gratitude Month. Try to write down each day 1-3 things you feel grateful for.

5th: It's Guy Fawkes Day / Bonfire Night. Try our quick Bonfire Night quiz (answers below) b

- What was Guy Fawkes' real first name?
- Which King did Guy Fawkes attempt to kill with his Gunpowder Plot?
- What year did the Gunpowder Plot take place?
- Which 'P' is the technical term for making and displaying fireworks?
- Although Guy Fawkes is the most well-known member of the Gunpowder Plot, who was the leader?

6th: Write a list of 1-5 things you would like to do or achieve during this month, such as phoning or writing a letter to a friend you haven't spoken to for a while, signing up for a social group or activity, or just watching a film or reading a book you've been meaning to check out for a while. Your goals can be as big or small as you like – whatever will help increase your happiness and/or sense of achievement this month!

7th: It's International Games Week. Plan a date to play your favourite board or card game with a friend or family member this week, or relax with a one-player game such as the card game Patience.

8th: Write an acrostic poem for the word 'Fireworks' (where each line of the poem starts with the next letter of the word fireworks).

9th: How many words can you make from the words Bonfire Night (e.g. Bite, fine)?

10th: On this day in 1981 the board game Trivial Pursuit was registered. Can you remember the themes for each of the game's original category colours? (Answers below)

11th: What is your favourite November memory? Whether it's a birthday, wedding, holiday, fireworks event or other special memory, spend some time reminiscing or writing about this.

12th: Get your home extra cosy for those cold November nights by investing in a new candle, blanket or cushion.

13th: It's World Kindness Day. Try to do one small act of kindness today, such as writing someone a kind note or card, sharing something you have baked, or giving someone an encouraging phone call.

14th:Write a short story, poem or paragraph based on this photo. Who would you like to say is in the photo? Where are they? What happens next?



15th: Draw and colour some fireworks.

16th: Solve this riddle: The more of me you take, the more you leave behind. What am I? (Answer below)

17th: Set yourself a challenge to move more throughout the day. Try to stand up briefly or go for a little walk every hour to boost your health and ward off any stiffness.

18th: We've included a wordsearch below.

19th: Wrap up warm, take a cold-weather walk and enjoy the sights of the changing season. Take a photo of an autumn scene if you can. This could be of a tree, a pile of leaves, or a bird or other creature you spot while out and about.

20th: Draw a picture from the photo you took on your walk yesterday, or of a scene out your window.
