Word Alive

Welcome back to the new season of Word Alive, when we meet at our house on the 8th September.

We will look at how the Bible should shape our views on a very real political, humanitarian problem - the refugee crisis in the Middle East. Or is it a crisis for Europe as refugees reach the borders? Thousands of men, women and children are fleeing the savagery of ISIS, the Syrian Regime, the Turkish persecution of Kurds, brutal African regimes - there is a lot to flee from and large numbers are fleeing to Europe.

But what is Europe meant to do? We have enough controversy over the freedom of movement arrangement making us resist immigration within our borders. With so many refugees now making their way through Europe, how do we stop them? Should we?

The Bible has a surprising amount to say about good and bad national policies concerning 'aliens' in the land. But is that all ruled out because we are in New Testament times? And what is a Christian response? Should we argue for all refugees to be granted asylum? Should we build camps for them? Should the UK participate in a proposed scheme to take in 40,000 refugees who have arrived in Greece and Italy in the last few months? Britain is not set to take any of the 40,000 as it is exempted from EU asylum policy unless it wants to take part. Is this right?
