### *From the Pastor...*

It is good to have John and Sue Wilson with us this Sunday. They are working in such a different setting to us where they are in the city, working from an older building but more significantly, they are in a culture more secular than ours and historically very opposed to church groups such as Baptists.

John and Sue have been in France with BMS World Mission since 1988 and are currently pastoring a church in Paris. We look forward meeting them and hearing about what they are currently involved with. Being church in such a culture requires a great deal of understanding of the people they are among and much godly wisdom. We ask the Lord to prosper all they do there in the Name of Jesus.

What about ourselves? We think we know our culture as we live in it. We are also tempted to keep to ourselves and not rock the boat, which leads to an insular Christian sub-culture that ceases to bring Christ to our communities in a meaningful way. So what can we do?

A useful first step is to understand the life circumstances of those you meet outside church. Work colleagues, neighbours, friends. Talk about their struggles and joys, sharing yours too. It maybe that joining in with a community project like the new Kingsteignton garden project will give you that chance to get alongside another and get to know just a little bit more about them and our community. And we can do that as part of our service to the Lord.
