For those of us who had the joy of worshipping alongside Darren, Christina and the youth on their many instruments this Sunday the words of the Lord as delivered by Amos might seem a little unreasonable. Surely God asks us to raise our voices in praise and worship. The Psalms are full of the music of the harp and the tambourine and it is a good thing to make a joyful noise, surely?

Well, it is good news for those of us who enjoy singing (although nobody who has had to stand near me would describe my singing as a joyful noise). Our tuneful, or otherwise, worship *is* pleasing to God, not smelly at all.....with a caveat.

The people Amos was warning were good at the singing. They were even good at remembering the sacrifices and saying all the right words at the right time. It's just that they had forgotten **why** and **who** it was all for. If God is not at the centre of our worship, then it is not pleasing to him at all. And by worship, of course, we mean singing on a Sunday morning AND our prayers AND our lives of service and love AND the interactions we have with friends and family and neighbours and.....everything!

Let's look for the worship in everything we do this week, the opportunities to speak of, to think about and to praise God's glory and then we can sing on Sunday knowing it is being listened to and loved by holy ears.
