From the Moderator

I was the minister in training here at KCBC, am now one of the ministers at Barton Baptist and Cluster Minister for Torbay - so it is my job to minister to the ministers and pick up pastoral vacancies as and when.

At some point in the new year, we can start the process of writing a profile for the church which will help you work out what sort of minister you are looking for to lead you into what God has planned for KCBC. So, this is a time of pulling together, listening to your leadership team, and most importantly tuning into, listening to and getting on board with the mind of Christ.

The Teaching from 26/10/25

In my talk last week I went through a number of practical ways we could “redeem our time” in terms of serving the Lord. I’ve had a few requests to go over these again in case you were there and need a reminder, or you weren’t there but still might find them useful. So, here they are again categorised in terms of action, growth, and witness. I’m happy to go over any of these with you if you have further questions.

Action: Living Purposefully

These are practical steps that help steward our time well in daily life:

- Prioritise prayer and Scripture: Begin (or end) each day with God’s Word and presence, anchoring your day in spiritual clarity.
 - Time-blocking for service: Schedule time weekly for acts of service – visiting the unwell, helping neighbours, volunteering.
 - Digital discipline: Limit social media and screen time to avoid distraction and reclaim hours for meaningful pursuits.
 - Family discipleship: Use mealtimes or bedtime for intentional conversations, Bible reading, or prayer with children.
- Growth: Deepening Faith and Character

These practices cultivate spiritual maturity and personal development:

- Spiritual journalling: Reflect on God’s activity in your life, tracking answered prayers, lessons learned, and areas of growth.
- Mentorship: Seek out or become a spiritual mentor – investing in others sharpens both parties.
- Learning sabbaticals: Dedicate a weekend or retreat to study theology, apologetics, or spiritual disciplines.
- Habit stacking (my favourite!): Pair spiritual practices with daily routines (e.g. praying while walking or cleaning, listening to sermons while commuting).

Witness: Sharing Christ Through Time

These examples show how time can be redeemed for eternal impact:

- Gospel hospitality: Invite others into your home for meals, creating space for spiritual conversations.
- Workplace witness: Use coffee breaks or team lunches to build relationships and share your faith naturally.
- Creative evangelism: Use your gifts – art, poetry, music – to express spiritual truths and spark curiosity.
- Community presence: Join local groups or initiatives not just to serve, but to be a light in secular spaces.

1. Go onto the internet and type kbcchurch.org.uk
2. On the Home Page in the top right-hand corner is a green bar and on it is written "online service" with an arrow.
