From the Minister

2,000 years ago, at a graveyard in the ancient city of Jerusalem, a problem occurred. The tomb used to put the body of Jesus of Nazareth was found empty. This needed investigating and the Temple authorities especially needed to locate the body and rebury it. If not, who knows what rumours might go around. After all, they had put guards in place to make sure there was no grave robbery or anything like that. Wouldn't want Temple security to get a bad name. The tomb remained empty and no body was ever found.

From outset of the resurrection of Jesus, every effort was put into getting facts together, investigating the evidence, cross examining the witnesses. Thomas was one of those. Don't just believe everyone. Find out for yourself. And so the accounts of the resurrection and the shared testimony of those who met with the risen Christ was passed on with confidence that the facts were straight. It might be popular to file the resurrection accounts under the 'baseless beliefs' category, rather like stories of dragons and goblins but that is bad filing. The accounts we have were born out of evidence-based fact finding. Jesus of Nazareth is resurrected, just like He said.

Thinking though our faith is no bad thing. It builds our confidence in what we devote our lives to, and it helps prune some of the less robust beliefs that get attached to Christian faith. The Resurrection of Christ is one thing we can be sure of. And as the apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. We have a lot to look forward to.
