- ▶ Healing – physical, emotional and spiritual

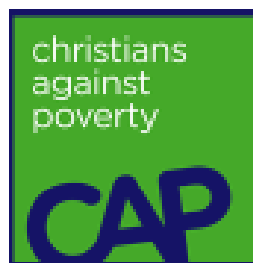
- ▶ A just peace

John 19:30 It is finished "Tetelestai"

It is finished, translation of the Greek word *Tetelestai*, was used in a business context on new testament receipts in biblical times, to indicate that a literal debt had been paid in full. It was used in a judicial context in court too, when a sentence was fully served - not like somewhat served or partially served - but completely, once and for all, served. Also, it was used in a military context to show that a battle had been won, indicating triumph and victory. So, when Jesus hangs on the cross and cries out *Tetelestai* - it is finished - he was declaring the debt of your sin is fully paid, the judgement for your sin has been fully served, and the spiritual war against sin and Satan has been completely won in Christ. The work of salvation, victory, reconciliation and a new life is fully yours.

It is finished.
