Father God, creator and sustainer of all life, have mercy on us as we prepare our hearts to experience Holy Week.


May we all, those with a young faith and others with a deep and steadfast faith, approach this most holy of times

#### Ukraine

The next lorry to Ukraine left on Tuesday (17<sup>th</sup> March) please pray that it arrives safely and for the safety of those delivering the aid in Ukraine and for all those receiving aid.

## A message from a Baptist pastor in in Ukraine (a key partner):-

Dear brother Hugh,

Warm greetings from Ukraine! I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude for your generous support (Lorry loads of humanitarian aid and monthly money grants). During this difficult time of war, your kindness and faithful partnership have brought real hope and help to many people here. We deeply appreciate your heart for Ukraine and your desire to stand with us in this season of need.

I would also like to share with you how your donations have been used in recent months to bless and support many lives:

- We continue to assist refugees who have been displaced by the war, as well as many local families in desperate need.
- We are supporting 10-12 families of soldiers who are currently serving at the front lines. These families often struggle to provide for their children while their husbands and fathers areaway defending our country. The soldiers don't always get paid by the Army.
- We also help families who have found themselves in **severe life circumstances**. One of them is Natasha—a courageous mother battling cancer. Despite her illness, she is raising her three teenage sons alone in a remote village. Your donations have made it possible for us to offer her practical help and encouragement during this very hard time.

In addition, we assist several families who are caring for children with cerebral palsy. These mothers dedicate their entire lives to their children and are in constant need of support.

Beyond helping families, your generosity has allowed us to:

- Purchase and deliver tourniquets to our soldiers on the front lines.
- Pay for **fuel for our chaplains**, enabling them to travel to dangerous areas where they minister to soldiers and deliver supplies.

- Produce camouflage nets, trench candles, and energy snacks at Grace Church, which we send regularly to the front.
- I and my wife visit and financially support the wives and children of soldiers, offering them encouragement and hope through personal connection and prayer.
- I continue to visit soldiers in hospitals, many of whom have no family visiting them. We often provide them with necessary medications and personal care items.
- In addition, our **mobile medical centre** from Grace Church continues to visit remote villages. We provide eye examinations, reading glasses for elderly people, check their heart and bloodpressure, and supply basic medications.
- Your support helps cover the costs of these glasses and medicines, making a huge difference in these communities.

Hugh, we are deeply grateful to you and all the brothers and sisters in England. Your donations are not only helping meet physical needs, but they are also bringing light, hope, and encouragement to those who need it most. Thank you for being such a vital part of this ministry. May God bless you all abundantly for your compassion and generosity! With sincere appreciation,
