## CHURCH MATTERS

### *Speakers' Corner!* I was born

and brought up in mining village in Fife Scotland. Church was not a part of my life then, not going to church and never attending Sunday school.

After school went to college in Edinburgh where I met Helen (now my wife). She attended Church so I accompanied her. This situation carried on for many years (church attending non Christian) On moving to Kingsteignton we attended the URC and when a church plant from Teignmouh was set up in Kingsteignton we started to attend there. The first minister KCBC appointed, Jim McNaughton, was from not very far away from me in Fife. He spent a fair amount of time just dropping in and chatting. Over time conversation developed into talk about faith. Eventually I decided to accept Jesus as Lord and Saviour and was baptised in 1992 (at over 44 years old) I became more involved in church (slowly) attending then leading housegroup, becoming a church elder, when without a minister leading service fairly regularly and when David Goddard held classes in instruction of preaching I felt called to attend. Since then I have preached a few times. So that is brief story of how I am here this Sunday.

Exploring faith isn't about finding a single "perfect" method it's about discovering meaningful ways to keep Jesus at the very centre of everything. Like everyone, I connect with Him in different ways, and that's part of the beauty of a living, personal relationship with Christ. Nobody just connects with Him on one path either, there's lots of cross-over - Bible Study, Fellowship and Prayer - each lead into one another. They encourage fresh perspectives, build shared experiences and deepen understanding with friends, allowing my faith to grow and flourish. Then there's creative expression which I am really enjoying, immersing myself completely in the Word making it feel more personal, tangible and oh so alive for me.

When I intentionally set aside time for Him, something shifts - the noise of the world fades, distractions lose their grip, and focus becomes clearer - and in those moments there's a sense of deeper peace and connection.

Keeping Jesus at the centre as I explore different ways to grow in faith, I create space for Him to guide, shape, and transform me. And in that space, I find not only clarity, but a renewed sense of purpose rooted firmly in His presence.

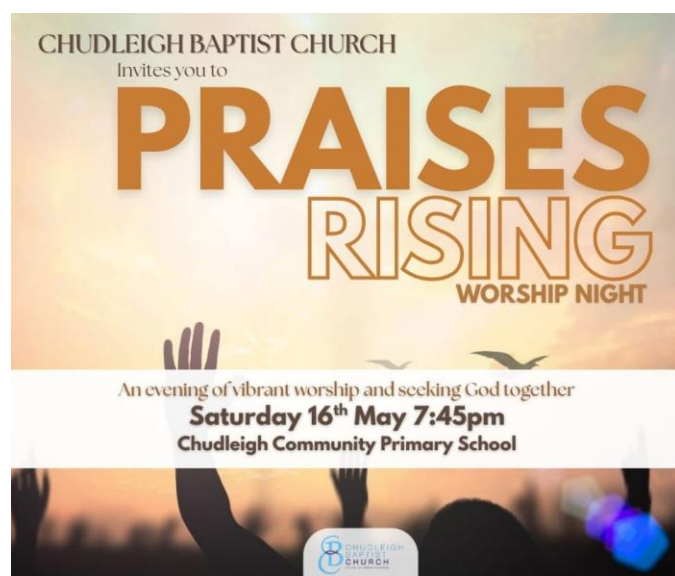
### Kingsteignton Town Council events:
