At our last Church Members meeting the members were presented with a review report of the "small group" activities in KCBC during 2026.

Here are the contributions from our two evening housegroups.

Haytor Drive Homegroup

We have been studying the Acts of the Apostles at the bi-monthly meetings.

The studies are led by Rob Nicholls who prepares a well-planned study, and we work through the selected passage for the evening verse by verse. Rob brings a background to the section we are looking at which he supports by illustrations and maps. We have progressed so far from the Ascension of Jesus, through the birth of the Church, and are now well into Paul's missionary journeys taking the Gospel to the Gentiles.

There are a good number attending each week and the number has increased during the year, and this also helps us get to know one another better as we discuss the study, and end with a period of prayer. We can share one another's needs and those of KCBC which we then bring to the Lord in prayer, as well as the things that are happening throughout the world which do need our prayers. Our fellowship is being deepened as we meet together, and we are conscious of the Lord's presence as we study together.

There is always a good welcome, starting with biscuits and drinks before we start the study. We are aware that members of the group are benefiting from regular study together in a smaller group. The discussions have been very helpful, and we are all learning something new each week, whether we are familiar with the passage being studied or not. Our understanding of scripture is being deepened and the opportunity to ask questions and for discussion is very helpful.

Message from Hugh at cr2ee

"When Sarah asked how many lorries last year I said ten lorries last year, but alongside this we also give financial support every month. In 2025 alone, we were able to send more than £150,000 to Moldova and over £280,000 to Ukraine. These funds help sustain all our work, supporting refugees and families living in poverty. That's nearly £36,000 per month. Just to show every £1 counts.

As a completely voluntary charity, we are truly blessed by the generosity and faithfulness of our supporters. It is remarkable how, almost every month, we are able to fill a huge lorry to the roof. Time and again, our volunteers lovingly sort through mountains of donated clothing. A single bag may seem small, but together they become an abundant provision.



"Scripture doesn't just make you more competent. It makes you more like Jesus. It forms patience when you'd usually hurry. Courage where you'd normally shrink back. Gentleness where you'd snap. Truthfulness when a half-truth would be easier. It reshapes the instincts you take into meetings, emails, parenting, budgeting, conflict, leadership, friendship, and the late-night thoughts that won't leave you alone. How to join the Sunday Service via Zoom

1. Go onto the internet and type kbcchurch.org.uk
2. On the Home Page in the top right-hand corner is a green bar and on it is written "online service" with an arrow.
3. Click on the green bar/arrow and you'll go to the online services page.
4. On Sunday morning there will be a link title "Join Zoom Meeting" click the link and Zoom should open and connect you to the meeting.



Sermon Recordings
