Tricia and I visited the National Trust property Buckland Abbey this week. 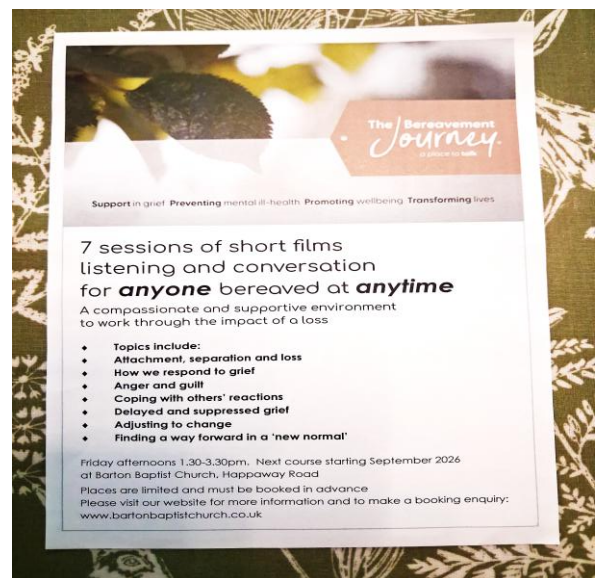
