KCBC Vision Day

Carl has provided a Pre-Vision Day Prayer Guide, spread over 3 weeks, for us all to follow, designed to ensure we are focused and ready to participate on the day.

1 week before Vision Day

Theme for the Week – Looking to the future

READ: Jeremiah 29:10-14

These famous words were not written to an individual but to all God's people whilst they were held in exile away from their homeland. It's good to know that in all times – even when things seem bleak – God does not abandon his people and that we can be sure of a hope-filled future with him! Discerning what God has store for us in the future at KCBC is not about us following our own individual whims or desires but rather earnestly seeking God's leading for us all as a community of his people and trusting that our future is secure in him.

QUESTION: What personal projects and passions do I need to lay down before God in order to hear more clearly how he is leading us as a whole church community? Baptist Ministers should be competent in most areas of ministry, but each will have particular passions, gifts, and experience. Taking into account my reflections from last week's prayers ('Taking Stock'), what are the one or two passions and/or gifts that I sense will be most important for our next Minister to have? What previous experiences in ministry will help our new Minister as they seek to prepare and lead us in this coming season?

PRAY: Thank God for his faithfulness to us at KCBC over the years through both good and challenging times. Praise God that he has a hope-filled plan for our future as a church community! Prayerfully set aside your individual passions and projects and ask God to help you hear his voice for the whole KCBC family and those in the communities we serve. Spend some time in quietness before the Lord... Do I sense the Holy Spirit prompting me to think of particular aspects of the mission and ministry of our church where the gifts, passions and previous experiences of a new Minister might be beneficial in seeing them develop and flourish? Pray God's blessing on the person who he is calling to serve as the next Minister at KCBC... may they too hear the Spirit's voice and respond to his leading.

ACT: Record any answers you have to the questions above now that you have spent time prayerfully considering them. If you feel God has given you any words, pictures or passages of Scripture to encourage others as we seek his guidance for our next steps as a church, please record them. There will be opportunity to share them as we move forwards through the process of calling a new Minister.

Please could everyone arrive by 1000hrs, which allows plenty of time for refreshments, as we will begin Session 1 at 1030hrs.

To reach the Conference Centre by car, go past the main entrance (the one you would use if visiting the actual Abbey) and take the next turning right (the signpost is quite small), follow the road to its natural end and turn right and follow along past the houses you'll then see a couple of signposts for the 'Conference Centre'.

There is plenty of parking, with disabled bays available (just after the entrance), at the Conference Centre and easy access for wheelchair users across the site. If you require transport to the venue, please speak with members of the Leadership Team who will help to arrange a lift.

Refreshments are available during the day, and the venue has been advised we need gluten free options (so if you haven't already shared any different intolerances, please do so, ASAP). In terms of lunch, the booking with the restaurant has been made and confirmation that individuals will pay for their own meal. If anyone is bringing their own lunch please note that we are not permitted to eat in the Conference Centre so, let's pray for clear skies and warm weather!

EQUIP TEACHING EVENTS

Upton Vale is running a series of **free Equip** events over the coming year - see www.uptonvale.org.uk/equip - these events are open to anyone who would like to study the Bible in greater depth.

Our next event is with Rev Dr Peter Morden from Bristol Baptist College. We want to encourage people to be deeply rooted in God's Word, grow in their understanding of Scripture, and help them to put their faith into action as we all seek to live out God's Kingdom in everyday life. We are asking people to sign up so we have an idea of numbers as tea/coffee and cake will be provided (people are being asked to bring their own packed lunch).

Here is a short description on our next event on Saturday, 26 September...

We are delighted to welcome Rev Dr Peter Morden, Principal at Bristol Baptist College for a special teaching series on 26 September. Peter will be teaching on Revival? Past, Present and Future. 'Revival' is a term used by Christians to describe times when God has worked in unusual power to bring significant renewal to communities and indeed nations.

This special day with Peter will blend biblical teaching with teaching on 'revivals' of the past, especially the eighteenth-century Evangelical Revival and the hugely positive ways this impacted Baptist life. We will also explore the so-called 'Quiet Revival' and consider what God might be doing across our own nation today.

There will also be an opportunity to pray together for God to work in power, both in our own lives and in the lives of others.

As part of our Equip programme, this special teaching event is completely free to attend and open to anyone who would like to study the Bible.

Christian Response to Eastern Europe –

So much is going on at the moment BUT we can make a difference!

Yes, it is approaching that time of year! So, if you would like to take part, we need your shoeboxes by **Sunday 25th October**

Each shoebox should ideally contain:

- 1 pair of mittens or gloves;
- warm hat;
- scarf;
- notebook and pen/pencils/erasure/sharpener/colouring pencils;
- toothpaste and toothbrush;
- soap and face cloth (hand wash is great but no shower gel or shampoo)
- a doing toy (skipping rope or ball);
- soft toy; and
- sweets/chocolate/biscuits.

Then it's up to you: but please ensure the box is well packed (to prevent movement on the journey and subsequent damage) a colouring book, a jumper or other clothing item, a ball can be added. The main difference is that for an adult you could include a liquid soap instead of a bar of soap, comb or hairbrush, a sewing kit, hand cream, small packets of tissues and make-up or nail varnish (especially for teenage girls). You don't need to include a soft toy/doll.

No Jars of coffee, loose teabags and tins of food, drugs or plasters, no packs of cards or reading material as most don't speak English

All items should be new, in date by at least 6 months and age appropriate.

Nothing within the shoebox should be wrapped and the box itself needs to be wrapped in a way that it can be opened to check the contents.

Please put a sticker on the outside to specify the age and sex of the intended recipient.

If you cannot do a full shoebox, please could you provide any of the suitable items listed, which can then be used to make up boxes.

Sermon Recordings
