

UPDATE

Following his safe return from visiting Moldova and Ukraine, Hugh Skudder provided us with an update at the prayer and news' meeting this week.

We heard many moving stories, for example - Alisa in Moldova, a single mum with three young boys to look after and no wage coming into the home, is making sure that Serge, a paralysed man living in her village, is cared for and is providing food and visits most days.

In Kiev, Hugh visited one of the Baptist churches we are supporting, where the ladies sit making little food packs of dried meat, dried fruit etc. to go to the frontline. Each food pack contains a handwritten note saying that the recipient is valued and loved by both the sender and God. In another part of the room they are making camouflage nets and candles in tins; anything they can do to help.

When Hugh was in Ukraine he was struck by the resilience of the people who are now exhausted by the continual bombing and who often feel forgotten. They ask that we pray for peace and an end to Ukraine's suffering.

We give thanks for

- the donations that have enabled us to give families ducks and chickens;
- all the soup kitchens providing nutritious food (often several times a week),
 play time for children and teaching, a safe place for young and old to come;
- for the summer camps especially those in Ukraine where children can come and just be children with none of the worries of war (unfortunately it is not safe to all stay together at night, so they go home in the evenings);
- For CR2EE's new mobile medical team as they travel the country giving assistance to those unable to pay for care.

We pray for

- the harvest in Moldova, where it has been very hot, barely any rainfall and so little has grown. If it fails people will go hungry this year;
- for all those caring for the disabled and vulnerable with no support (it is not uncommon for husbands to leave once a child is known to have difficulties). That the local church can support them and provide hope where there seems to be none;
- for the pastors who are ministering in a war-torn country, both at home and on the frontline, that they may know God's strength and peace;
- for all the families divided by the war that they too may know God's strength and peace.
- Another lorry is due to leave here soon, please pray that all goes well with the planning, paperwork, journey and distribution.

Thank you for your ongoing support. As one of the ministers said, "You are not just giving us aid, you are giving us hope and reminding us that someone cares!"

Hopefully by now you have heard of the Youth Essentials Course that has been running in the SWBA. It is all round training for every youth leader, Minister or aspiring youth leader, and following some encouraging feedback we are

doing it all again in September!

The course will be online on Thursday mornings, 10am-12noon, from September 19th-November 28th (with a break in half term). I will be leading this 10-week course, along with other experienced practitioners from the South West.

The course will be taught over 10 teaching mornings, looking at the following topics:

- 1. **Why youth ministry?** How does youth work make a difference to young people?
- 2. **Adolescent development?** How do young people grow and change as teenagers?
- 3. **Growing up digital?** How are social media and other technologies changing their world?
- 4. **Growing Up Gen Z?** What different beliefs and values do young people have today?
- 5. **Family Life?** What are the experiences of young people at home?
- 6. **Christian discipleship?** How do young people develop and grow in faith?
- 7. **Sexuality & gender?** How do young people express and explore sexuality and gender?
- 8. **School Life?** What are the experiences of young people in education?
- 9. **Emotional & physical health?** What impacts young people's well-being?
- 10. **Mission & exploring faith?** How do young people explore and understand Christian faith?

There is no charge for those doing the course as a one-off. For those attending as part of the Pathways programme, there will be a charge of £20 to cover the assignments included with the assessment. There is no assessment for those just doing the course.

Once you have registered you will also receive a copy of the accompanying handbook which will be posted to you.
