*At our last Church Members meeting the members were presented with a review report of the "small group" activities in KCBC during 2026.*

*I have been posting in here sections of that report for the wider church community to see.*

*This week, here is a report from Tricia about KILTs*

At KiLTs (Kingsteignton Little Tots) we have a team of 8/9 helpers all of whom are vital to the smooth running of Kilts from setting up the activities, providing drinks, chatting with the carers (mums, dads and grandparents) and making craft with the children, to fitting everything back in the cupboard at the end!

We are in contact with 40 families with a range of 9 to 25 families attending each week so that can be at least 18 to 50 adults and children at a time. At the moment we have quite a lot of grandparents bringing their grandchildren along.

We had a very successful Nativity play in December with lots of participation from the adults and children, with the highlight of real sheep (thanks J and K!). In their gift bag from the wise man, they had a Christmas story book and various goodies to take home.

We also have a 'Travelling Nativity' where the families can take home a box with knitted characters (Mary, Joseph, baby Jesus etc) along with a story of the nativity so they can play at home, acting out the real meaning of Christmas. This year we had 'light' as our theme and the children were able to put a knitted candle on their own Christmas tree to remind them of the Christmas story.

Every Easter a group of knitters get together to produce covers for small chocolate eggs. So far we have made chicks, rabbits, baskets and sheep. The children love them and it gives us an opportunity to share the meaning of Easter. We also have a selection of Easter themed books in our book corner for them to read.

It is a privilege to be able to serve God in the community. The parents and carers are coming to us, so it is an ideal opportunity to share something of God's love for them. It may be the singing of Christian songs and the take home bible craft/story sheet at the end of a session or the sit down with a cup of tea along with a listening ear if needed. We don't know what God has in store for these parents and children but maybe a little seed has been planted in their lives.

#### Message from Hugh at cr2ee

"When Sarah asked how many lorries last year I said ten lorries last year, but alongside this we also give financial support every month. In 2025 alone, we were able to send more than £150,000 to Moldova and over £280,000 to Ukraine. These funds help sustain all our work, supporting refugees and families living in poverty. That's nearly £36,000 per month. Just to show every £1 counts.

As a completely voluntary charity, we are truly blessed by the generosity and faithfulness of our supporters. It is remarkable how, almost every month, we are able to fill a huge lorry to the roof. Time and again, our volunteers lovingly sort through mountains of donated clothing. A single bag may seem small, but together they become an abundant provision.


