This will help us construct a profile which will contain a contribution from across the fellowship.

Personally, I am finding it a blessing to be able to invite a variety of visiting preachers, mostly from around the local area, and supported by several of our fellowship who are able and willing to take part in bringing the All Age and Teaching section of the services to the church. Along with our regular Musicians leading the 'Sung Worship.' We are being well blessed, and it is also encouraging to have several members taking the lead and pulling services together.

In the remaining months of this year, we have experienced visiting speakers to look forward to as well as giving one or two younger speakers a chance to gain experience as they come to minister.

Having considered the Parable of the 'Ten Virgins' a week or so ago let us encourage one another to be ready for the incoming Minister, and keep our lamps full of oil, the Holy Spirit, in our daily lives and to feed on God's Word which is a 'living word' through which we can receive our Daily Bread. I am looking forward to the days ahead with anticipation of seeing God work in our fellowship and bring us together in unity as Jesus himself prayed for the night before He went to the cross.

The film features footage from last November's National Emergency Briefing, bringing together leading UK experts in climate science, food security, health, economics, national security and nature.

It presents a calm, evidence-based overview of how the climate and nature crisis is affecting everyday life in Britain - and what the science says about risks and responses. More information in link:

How to join the Sunday Service via Zoom

1. Go onto the internet and type [kcbchurch.org.uk](https://www.kcbchurch.org.uk)
2. On the Home Page in the top right-hand corner is a green bar and on it is written "online service" with an arrow.
3. Click on the green bar/arrow and you'll go to the online services page.
4. On Sunday morning there will be a link title "Join Zoom Meeting" click the link and Zoom should open and connect you to the meeting.
